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## ADDENDUM - C 2019 NBL NATIONAL CONFERENCE PRIZE MONEY

(All requirements in this addendum supercede any contradictory requirements in the 2019 NBL Tournament Promoter's Agreement)

All NBL National Conference tournaments in the US must give out a minimum of \$3,000 US (Canada - a minimum of 3,000 cn). The breakdown must include the following minimum amounts of prize money to be given to the following divisional and/or grand-championship winners.

As required by SKITA Rules, all players must perform in the finals to receive any prize money (Except Senior Men's Grandchampionship). The only exception is when either the tournament medical personnel or Center Referee grant an exception based upon a legitimate medical concern. Players in any given prize money division may agree to split prize money amongst themselves prior to the finals, however, prize money will not be awarded in any division if the Arbitrator feels that the players appeared to have pre-determined a winner between themselves by throwing the win to their opponent.
