Any Judge may replace any or all the materials in the players' set-up with the player provided samples of the same material and then examine that players' set-up material for safety, material for breakability. All players must remove all breaking remanents and provide their own containers for such removal. Players must angle their routines so as not to endanger the Judges, spectators and their people used as props.



ELIMINATIONS - Registration

1. QUALIFICATIONS: The Amateur Internationals (AMI) are open to any one of blackbelt (BB) or under blackbelt (UBB) rank.

2. SKIL SEEDING & LATE PROCESSING: 2016 SKIL ranked members can be seeded (placed) according to their ranking. Players sending in point charts and/or memberships postmarked after the September 10th deadline charts and/or memberships postmarked after the September 10th deadline will be charged \$50 (plus any applicable membership fee) in order to be added to the final 2016 standings to be seeded if the rankings have already been processed and will only be accepted if postmarked at least fifteen (15) days before the start of the AMI. Seeded SKIL players not pre-registering by the November 21 deadline will also be charged \$50 to retain their seeding. Players placing in any division in their State Games can receive 30 extra ranking points applied to their players card for first place, 20 points for second and 10 for third for the exact same division in the AMI. This can be applied only at the AMI registration on December 25.31 and only if asked applied only at the AMI registration on December 25-31 and <u>only</u> if asked for when going through the registration line. **Note** - Players in states

without State Games can request for the same points based upon their state/province final SKIL rankings for their equivalent divisions, but only when going through the registration line as well.

3. RANK: You must enter in and compete at the same rank in all AMI divisions with the following exception: If you are now a BB and ONLY if you have an UBB SKIL ranking, you may compete this one last time as an advanced UBB or you may compete as a BB, with or without a ranking, but you can not compete as both an UBB and a BB in the AMI no matter whether you are

ELIMINATIONS - Registration

- **QUALIFICATIONS:** In order to be eligible for a Super Grands (SG) division, you must be ranked (seeded) as one of the top five (5) players in any of the NBL Conferences in the final rankings (www.nblskil.com appearing late October, 2016); OR, you may register and compete in the division as a wild card seed (no ranking). You can compete in any division, but you can only enter once per division no matter how many seeds you have.
- 2. NBL JR. SPARRING RANKING: As a junior player, if your weight changes or fluctuates during the year, you must decide which division you want all your points to reside at the end of the season (October). Unless you inform us differently in the correct manner via NBL point chart by October 10th (or within 7 days of any remaining NBL tournament you attend after October 10), all your junior player's points in both point and continuous sparring will probably be bumped into the weight division you competed in at the last NBL tournament you attended. Fees for changes apply after the October dates (see #3 below). Players MUST compete in the division at the Super Grands (SG) that they weigh in at SG registration regardless of where their points are in the rankings, so players must make sure their points are in the division that they will weigh at in the SG
- **RANKINGS ERRORS:** If you fail to verify or correct your NBL ranking points by point chart by September 30 (or within 7 days of the last NBL tournament you attend in October) and then find an error in your points that you want corrected for SG seeding you will be charged \$25 to have each rankings error corrected despite whose fault the error was. However, errors in other players points that affect your rankings will be corrected after the September 30 deadline without charge to you. Corrections to rankings for SG seeding made after the SG pre-registration deadline of November 21 will cost \$50 per correction and will only be made if the correction can still be verified and will cost \$50 no matter whose fault the
- WILD CARD SEEDING: If you are not NBL ranked, but register as a wild card (WC) in a division, you will be run off in preliminary play which will take place immediately prior to the division you're entering and in that same ring. Players (WC and seeded) of any given title division will need to show up to their ring at their scheduled time (see daily schedule pages). Only the first place (WC) winner of each of the divisional WC run-offs earns a seed to advance to the SG divisional eliminations in their respective division. This (WC) winner has, in effect, earned a position that is equivalent to a fifth (5th) place seed in competition thereafter.
- AGE: You must compete at the age you were on January 1, 2016 at 12:01 a.m. (exceptions for those turning 18, 35 or 45 during the year: see SKITA V.B.4). The NBL must receive a valid certified (no photocopies) birth certificate or valid driver's license or valid passport sent to our offices or presented upon final registration at the SG despite your age. Once the NBL has verified your age or has received a certified birth certificate or notarization of same, it may not be required again in the future, as long as you pre-register and we have it recorded. If you fail to provide positive proof of age by the SG, you will be required to pay a non-refundable \$50 processing fee and sign a "Verification of Age Statement" and will be required to send us positive proof of age by certified mail to the NBL offices postmarked within fifteen (15) days from the last day of the tournament. If NBL doesn't receive the positive proof by this date then you may lose whatever placement you took in your world title division and any other titles for the year and be subject to suspension from future NBL/SKIL events and/or subject to an increased fine of \$100 or more by
- 6. WEIGH IN: You must weigh in (if there is a choice of weight divisions) and meet the weight of the division you are ranked in or that you wish to enter in as a wild card. This includes all ages for point and continuous sparring. You can only weigh-in and compete in one weight class. Weigh-in is open during all registration hours (see daily schedule pages).
- MUSICAL DIVISIONS: All musical forms and weapons divisions that are labed as "choreographed" MUST be performed to the rhythm (various beats) of the music without the use of sound effects for the choreography requirement. (See "Rules at a Glance" #10 page 25 in this brochure - This supercedes SKITA 8/99). The musical sound system is provided, as is the person who runs it. If you are using music you MUST turn in a separate compact disc (CD) for each and every musical division that you are competing in, upon registering at the tournament. Only CD's are acceptable (MP3 discs should work but are not guaranteed and are not allowed for NBL Grand Finale competition) (A CD player that will be used in the rings will be available at registration. It is the players' responsibility to ask to test their CD if they have concerns about their CD's usability). You will not receive your entry wristband without submitting the CD's that you intend to use. You are also responsible to bring any duplicate CD's to use for practicing and to bring an appropriate duplicate CD to your division in case your original CD is misplaced or gets damaged (You will be allowed to use an iPod as a replacement with a \$25 penalty fee). After the division ends, you can pick up your originally submitted CD from the person running the CD player. If you advance to the NBL Grand Finale you must

bring your CD (no MP3) to the statistics table before you will be given a backstage pass for your Grand Finale. All CD's must have the player's name and division number written on, or printed on a label and attached to the top of the CD that is to be played. Please try to supply your CD in paper jacket or thin case. The music may be recorded more than once on the CD in case something happens to the first recorded copy.

GRAND FINALES

All 120 NBL Super Grands world titles divisions (except breaking) are decided between the last two contestants in each division on stage in one of five Grand Finales. NBL Breaking divisions will not have the final two players of the eliminations compete again to determine their world titles. The eliminations winners will be the world champions. The breaking winners will be awarded their world title belts in the Grand Finale and may be asked to perform their winning routines

in a Grand Finale as a demonstration only.

General Seating for each Grand Finale is Ringside Seating is \$4.95 per person per Finale and includes table seating and snacks and allows early entrance, but is limited to less than 50 applicants. A ticket is only good for the Finale that it is purchased for. General seating (players and spectators that have purchased a daytime wristband) will be on a first come, first serve seating basis free of charge starting about 20 minutes before each Finale.

IMPORTANT FINALE NOTES

- 1. TICKET HOLDERS People with Finale spectator tickets must be seated in a chair in the appropriate roped off section.
- 2. NON-TICKET HOLDERS People without tickets, but with a wristband will only be allowed entrance if space is available. They will be allowed seating 10 minutes prior to starting time.
- 3. RE-ENTRY You <u>MUST</u> present your ticket stub or wristband to re-enter.
 4. ENTERING STAGE FROM AUDIENCE <u>ANYONE</u> entering the stage from the audience or crossing the player runways $\underline{\text{WILL BE}}$ stopped by a police or security officer. Don't even try it!! Absolutely no gathering or standing in front of the stage. The police or security will either escort you to your seat or out of the building and fine you \$25 per infraction.
- 5. BACKSTAGE WRISTBAND / VIP PASS Anyone with a backstage wristband or working staff with a VIP pass must enter at the backstage entrance (Grand Foyer - Rear of Ballroom). The backstage entrance is only for, and to be used by, the final two players of each division, their coach, Finale Referees and selected staff.
- 6. ENTERING AUDIENCE FROM STAGE Anyone using the backstage entrance can only enter the seated audience by returning through the backstage entrance, and re-entering through the spectator entrance.
- 7. APPAREL FOR BACKSTAGE ENTRANCE -

PLAYERS - Must be in uniform or dressed according to SKITA Rules. COACHES - Must be in professional apparel - NO t-shirts, tank tops, sweat shirts or apparel with writing on it unless the writing pertains to the player's team, school or sponsor. Shirt and tie or professional team jackets are required. REFEREES - Only tie and jacket or equivalent - PLEASE.

SUPER SHOW & GRAND AWARDS

The Super Show includes the Overall World Grands and the Awards Presentation for all the first place winners of both the Super Grands and Amateur Internationals. Now in its twenty-seventh year, this Overall Grand Champion competition and Sport Karate Awards Presentation is the largest of its kind, with attendance last year topping 700 people from coast to coast as well as from many other countries. This years semi-formal Finale Super Show again includes a public presentation of the championship rings to the new NBL World Champions, the 1st place awards to the Amateur International winners, presentation of the NBL Hall of Fame awards and staff recognition. (See page 24 for Super Show schedule).

WHEN: Saturday evening, December 31, at 6:00pm at the Grand Finale stage. Amateur Awards-presented first, Super Grands Awards to follow intermixed with the World Grandchampionship competition.

COST: No fee required, however we offer reserved team/school tables up front where the action is. Tables seat nine people and cost \$99 per table and will be provided with snack foods. They will be reserved and marked for your group when they arrive. You must pre-register to reserve a table.

SAME DAY REGISTRATION FEE FOR SUNDAY & MONDAY:

Players registering or picking-up their pre-registration for Tuesday, December 27 or Wednesday, December 28, on the same day as their competition will be surcharged \$29 - no exceptions. So please pickup your registration material the day before. This is to deter any large influx of morning registration preventing the tournament from starting on time. This will not apply to players entering additional divisions after already having their registration processed previously.

BREAKING DEPOSIT: In all breaking divisions a \$55 deposit is required by all players. \$50 will be refunded within six (6) weeks after SG providing clean up, means of removal and vacuuming was made of everyone's material and no damage was done to the facility by yourself. \$5 will be kept as a processing fee. Don't count on leaving your old breaking material with the tournament facility. You are responsible for taking your breaking remnants back with you or disposing of properly away from the facility property.

You must purchase a players pass, weekly pass, daily pass or have been given a V.J.P. pass in order to enter any eliminations competition areas regardless if you're a black belt, a master, a grand master, a great grand master, a great grand master pubah, a 10th dan, a 20th dan, founder of your style, founder of karate, the Queen of England or an important someone's Mom!! Attendees willing to referee or scorekeep will be paid if needed as staff, but still must purchase a spectator pass initially.

COACH'S PASS:

Allows a coach into the coach's box from the player area when their player is competing in sparring only, not forms. It is not for video taping. A coach CANNOT be in the player area until the player they are coaching is "on deck" or "up" competing. Cost is \$25 (\$30 after 11/21) per person in addition to a spectator pass or player fee.

PRESS PASSES:

Any reputable photographer or journalist that legitimately represents any news media can ask for and may be granted a press pass at the discretion of the NBL. Requests must be in writing and postmarked by November 21. A duplicate set of all photographs taken at the SG must be supplied to NBL with complimentary right of use.




- 1. RESPONSIBILITY You must send in your registration form and player cards if you are pre-registering. You are responsible for all information to be complete and correct, not any tournament registration staff member that helps you.
- PLAYER CARDS You must fill out one player card (see center spread tear-out or use any cards with 2016 copyright) for EVERY division you enter, in both the Super Grands and Amateur Internationals. For team divisions, each of the three (3) players must have separate cards filled out and submitted together. No team sparring cards will be accepted individually.
- **NO CHANGES** Once you register for a division, you cannot change it. You must register and pay for the new division.

- **4. TEAM REPRESENTATION** A player can only represent one (1) national or regional team (that enlists players from different schools), but may represent more than one (1) school or school team if they train for different events at different schools. National or regional teams cannot be represented as school teams that include students that don't regularly train at their school.
- REGISTRATION MUST BE IN PERSON Any person that is being registered as a player, spectator or coach must be present in person in order to complete their registration process and receive their proper registration material including wristbands. All team sparring players must be present in person at registration at the
- same time to receive their team sparring material.

 REGISTRATION SEQUENCE Registration will begin Sunday, 12/25 at 7pm. Sequence numbers (numbered paper vouchers) will be handed out starting at 6pm on 12/25 and starting again at noon on 12/26. After getting your number you may then leave and come back as you wish without having to wait because anyone with the lowest number will be the next person allowed into the registration room.
